We began 2020 on a high note this winter. We were proud to present the Portland Youth Philharmonic's offering of one of their finest musicians, cellist Taylor Yoon, along with her sister, pianist Lauren Yoon who was home for the holidays from her studies at the Peabody Conservatory in Baltimore. The sisters provided a lovely performance. Taylor is one of 40 contestants who is auditioning for a scholarship this year.

Scholarship update

We received an immediate response to our scholarship announcement posted to our website on December 3rd. By December 27th, we received our maximum of 40 applicants and now have an additional 4 of 7 held in a standby status. Our lineup includes 16 pianists, eight cellists, six violinists, four voice and an assortment of six wind and brass instrumentalists. Two adjudicators have been selected for the audition on April 18th and an evening event on May 5th has been added to our performance schedule following our May 4th Tea to accommodate the overflow of students.

Each group is made up of outstanding young musicians who audition and are seated solely according to their ability. They range in age from 7 to 22, come from communities across the region, and represent over 70 different schools.
